We Offer A More Affordable Option To Expensive Referral Hospitals For Orthopedic and Other Major Surgeries



During Dr. Bradford's 19 years in practice, she has become increasingly aware of the widening gap in cost between Veterinary General Practice and Referral Hospitals. When a pet requires a more complicated surgery, there are fewer Veterinary General Practitioners with the knowledge and experience to perform those procedures. As a result, pet owners are left with expensive referral hospitals as their only option. Dr. Bradford's unique post-graduate experience in surgery allows her to offer a more affordable option while not compromising patient care and outcome. As a result of her training in advanced soft tissue and orthopedic surgery, she is able to offer surgeries for bone fractures and joint repair (cruciate ligament, patellar luxation, collateral ligament, and osteochondritis dessicans (OCD) procedures). She is also experienced in the long term management of arthritis. Along with her orthopedic experience, she performs emergency gastrointestinal foreign body surgery, gastropexies, bladder surgery, splenic surgery, internal organ biopsies, and many other abdominal procedures.

Services

Preventive Care For All Life Stages

Proper preventive care includes wellness exams and vaccinations, wellness blood testing, heartworm prevention, flea and tick prevention, parasite prevention and control, and health certificates (USDA/APHIS and Accredited for International travel).

Dental Care

There are times when dental care in addition to brushing is needed. Dental cleanings involve a full assessment of the teeth, periodontium, gingiva, and oral cavity during general anesthesia. Digital dental xrays are performed to assess the degree of periodontal disease and the health of the teeth. Treatment for periodontal disease includes antibiotics, and extractions when hospice care is needed. Our goal is to when significant disease is present.

Urgent Care

When a pet requires immediate veterinary care, an examination, diagnostic testing, and treatment are performed. For more serious conditions, the pet is stabilized prior to transfer to a nearby emergency hospital.

Advanced and Routine Surgeries

We perform advanced soft tissue and orthopedic surgeries in addition to spays, neuters, and growth removals. We take anesthesia and surgery very seriously. All of our anesthetized patients are carefully monitored throughout their procedures. Our surgical patients receive an IV catheter, IV fluids, and peri-operative pain management.

Senior Care

Our pets are living longer! Multiple age-related conditions are discussed and managed so your senior pet can live a longer, happier life.

Hospice Care

As our pets live longer, there may come a time provide palliative treatment to comfort our terminally ill patients.

Behavioral Counseling

Animal behavior problems play a significant role in disrupting the human/animal bond. A physical exam and bloodwork are performed to determine if there is an underlying illness causing the behavioral problem. Counseling and behavioral modification medications may be prescribed to help manage adverse behaviors. Referral to a Veterinary Behavioral Doctor may be indicated in some cases.
